30 years ago, The Salvation Army Youth Outreach Service (TSA, YOS) began operations. A humble beginning, YOS was started by TSA Officers using a house in the Eastern suburbs of Brisbane to offer services to the young people in the area. Outreaching services were the prime assistance in the early years.

The values that started the service; genuine concern for others, willingness to want to break the cycles of poverty and despair for young people, unconditional love and advocacy were carried out with a spiritual ferment, ensuring that the work reflected God's love for young people in crisis. While the type of youth services YOS operates have changed, those values embedded at the conception of YOS remain.

COURT SUPPORT PROGRAM UPDATE

Hi there YOS Community! Its Marti here, the Advocacy & Justice Support Youth Worker giving you a quick program update. Since you last heard from me in June, I have worked with another 40 young people whilst they have navigated legal issues.

Such an important part of my role is advocating for young people, which means being the voice that speaks up for fundamental needs and rights. Over the past three months I have experienced the impact that advocacy has at the individual level and thanks to this support we have had some great outcomes including:

- The Department of Housing granting a transfer request for a family who have been the targets of racism and violence from their neighbours
- 3 young people were not excluded from mainstream schools as a result of our support and advocacy
- 2 young people feeling supported enough to complete protection orders and speak with Police officers face to face. I was told by these young people afterwards that they felt *really empowered*
- 8 young people have received lighter sentencing as a result of my successful advocacy

Watch this space as it's not just Christmas that is around the corner. History is in the making with the new legislation that will bring young people aged 17 years, into Queensland's Youth Justice System. The new legislation will commence in November 2017 and will bring Queensland into line with the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, and the law in all other Australian jurisdictions.

ACCOMMODATION PROGRAM RE-LAUNCHED

The East Brisbane Accommodation Program has now been christened with a new name, in order to reflect the program's aim and purpose of creating a stable and supportive base for young people to launch into independence: LaunchPad!

YOS has received a Community Grant to fit out and decorate the tenant's community space, and a local artist will be hired to create a spectacular mural to coincide with the renaming of the program. Everyone is excited to see the final results!

All of the new tenants have settled in and are making progress with their goals, and are facing challenges as they arise. They are actively engaging in restorative justice processes in order to resolve conflicts, which help them to understand each other's perspectives and to restore damaged relationships. It can be a confronting process, but a unique opportunity for learning and growth.

One long term tenant has successfully obtained independent accommodation and moved out of the program. The YOS team are happily celebrating his achievements and how far he has travelled in his journey. More celebration is to come with two other tenants proudly completing Year 12 in the next few months, and another tenant accomplishing her TAFE course certificate.

With the YOS 30th Birthday coming up in October, invitations will be sent out to current and previous tenants. Hopefully some old faces will appear and old stories told, and an opportunity to share in their journeys since their time at YOS.

The Pirlirra class students have been working hard in the classroom to achieve their goals and over the last two months have also enjoyed a few excursions, which have been varied and enjoyed by all.

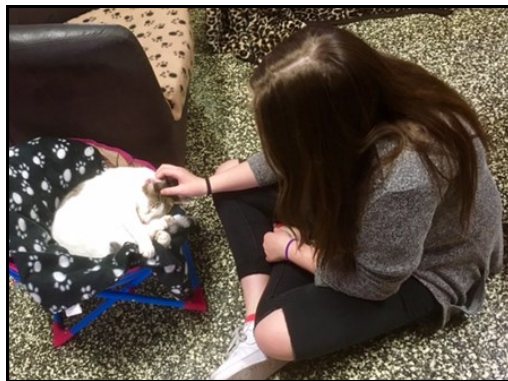
Classroom Painting

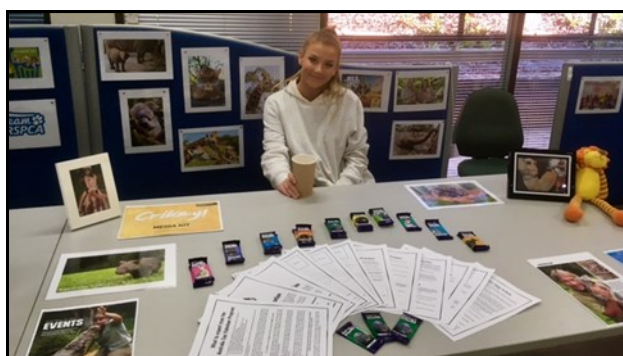
Cat Café
